Hardware essentials from front door to garden gate.

1. AUTHENTIC KNOCK

Capped with a fleur-de-lis, the original of this rugged iron door knocker graces homes Arts & Crafts to Tudor Revival and Chateausque. The textured, matte-black surface is lacquered for protection. Measuring 8 1/4" tall x 3 1/4" wide, it's \$114. Acorn Manufacturing, (508) 339-4500, acornmfg.com

2. SAND-CAST SUITE

Fitted with a sculptural handle and thumb latch, the Arched Mortise Entry Set is made of 90% recycled bronze content. Shown in the dark-bronze finish, the sand-cast suite is 18" long x 3" wide; \$1,008 and up. [Ashley Norton](http://AshleyNorton.com), (800) 393-1097, ashleynorton.com

3. SPEAKEASY ERA

The Speakeasy Window Grille is reminiscent of both Prohibition-era and Spanish Colonial Revival detailing. In hand-wrought iron, the five-bar grille has five mounting points. At 13 1/2" tall x 13 1/2" wide, it's \$64.95. The Kings Bay, (800) 910-3497, thekingsbay.com

4. ENGLISH TWIST

In a design used in Great Britain for centuries, the deluxe version of the flush-mounted Twisted Ring gate latch includes padlock eyes and gate stop.
